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### INTRO

As a 30-year-old unmarried woman, in the South no less, I went through the frustrating times that singleness can bring. When looking for resources to guide me on this journey, I really wanted something that would actually make me feel lucky to be a single woman and get me excited about the unique opportunity that I had in front of me, but I never found it. The more I looked around, the more I saw that single women seemed to be mostly characterized by sadness and waiting. # DAILY DEVOTIONS

LET'S DIG DEEP FOR TRUTH one

### THE MIND

"RENEWING THE MIND IS A LITTLE LIKE REFINISHING FURNITURE. IT IS A TWO STAGE-PROCESS. IT INVOLVES TAKING OFF THE OLD AND REPLACING IT WITH THE NEW. THE OLD IS THE LIES... THE NEW IS THE TRUTH."

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Forget everything you have been taught about singleness from the world's perspective. It's probably not very good stuff anyway. Let's start with a blank slate and build our views on the truth in God's Word. We have been taught by the world to give way too much control to our emotions, but let's decide not to operate strictly from how we feel. Let's live our lives based on the words from the mouth of God.

Over the last year and a half, I have been reading through the Bible and I can't begin to tell you all the difference it has made in my life. Being able to saturate my mind in the word of God is such a gift and has so much more transformative power than I sometimes realize. Through it we can learn so much about who God is. From the Old Testament, learning about His faithfulness, provision, and purpose to the New Testament where we get to see fulfillment of His promises with the birth and ministry of Jesus and the beginnings of the Church. Even though the events of the Bible happened long ago, it is still so relevant to our lives, and once we really dig in, we will begin to see that.

As we read, we have to remember, that we are not alone in this transformation! As Christians, we have received the Holy Spirit and the Holy Spirit gives us the power to know the mind of Christ. Because of this we can have confidence that we WILL be transformed as we read scripture and spend time with the Lord.

Thinking like the mind of Christ has the power to...

- bring you joy, peace, and understanding during the difficult times
- strengthen your faith when you can't see his plan
- see His plan
- be more like Christ

When we think and act like Christ we have the power to really change our lives, but the mind is where it starts. We need to be intentional in seeking understanding of the mind of Christ and training ourselves to think like Him. It won't just happen automatically.

Anytime I have tried to change by my own strength, I have failed. If we simply change our actions without retraining our mind, the change will not stick. Focus on cultivating a mind like Christ and leave the results up to Him.

## "THOSE THAT HAVE THEIR HEARTS FULL OF THIS WORLD ... HAVE A DEAF EAR TO THE GOSPEL." Matthew Henry Commentary

If we were all in a room together right now, I'd ask you to share all the things that people have said to you about your singleness - some would probably be hilarious, but others might be hurtful. I'd share how when my twin sister was engaged I got asked probably one million times to see "my ring" or about how wedding planning was going. After she got married, it was always "Are you the married one?", which led to me feeling like "the other one". But I have no hate for those comments or the people who said them, cause let's be real here... the world has made us all believe that for 20-somethings, marriage is the holy grail.

There seems to be a general timeline for life that people have become accustomed to. When they meet someone who isn't on that track, it sort of makes people uncomfortable and they say things that can come off hurtful. (Side note, decide now not to be offended by every comment people make about your singlehood. It will make your life much easier and it's generally not their intention to offend anyway!) I remember telling my sister often "I'm cool with being single! I just wish everyone else was cool with me being single too!" My only solution, I thought, was to move to a big city where it was more socially acceptable to be single later in life, then I came across this little verse...

"The things that most people think are important are worthless as far as God is concerned." Luke 16:15b (CEV)

Call me crazy, but I think this is going to be my new life verse.

In this passage, Jesus is speaking about the Pharisees and their love of money, but I think we can apply this to anything the world puts too much emphasis on. People might not say it outright, but sometimes the judge-y comments we hear tell of the underlying idea that if you are not married then you are missing out or there is something wrong with you. This can start to put a lot of pressure on you, but the

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#### SEASONS

"FREEDOM COMES IN REALIZING THAT MARRIAGE AND SINGLENESS ARE ROLES IN WHICH WE CARRY OUT A HIGHER CALLING OF SERVING THE LORD, AND NOT PARTICULAR CALLINGS IN AND OF THEMSELVES."

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I remember a friend, who was a mom, telling me she thought I had a glamorous single girl life. I was shocked. "Who me? But I'm not glamorous... Go on." She told me it was great that I got to have girls nights when I wanted to, wore makeup (This made me giggle! Surely I will continue to wear makeup even as a newlywed or mom! ;)), and had the freedom for adventure!!!

That conversation, though seemingly silly, opened up my eyes to a lot! There were opportunities that I was taking for granted, because I didn't realize that they might not always be around. My twin sister (who is married and birthed me my very best friends/nieces) and I soon started a back and forth where we would say... "I'm jealous you get to 'fill in the blank'!" It started out as a joking thing, but I think it has helped both of us to recognize some things that we should be grateful for in the season we are in.

One thing that I have learned, through the heart to hearts with my married friends is that all seasons have the good, but they also have the bad (or the cost). It's easy to see the pros of others' seasons, because that is what is put out there on display. But when we engage closely in the lives of others, you get to see the good times and the tough times, and hopefully we can learn from them. It's good to be realistic about different seasons, so that you don't become disillusioned with rose colored glasses of desire for any one thing. This is one reason why comparison is so dangerous. We usually make comparisons based on what we think, rather than what is true.

Another thing that I have learned about seasons is that they only last for as long as the Lord allows. They are each gifts from God. Whether that is being a wife, a mother, or a career woman, you are not guaranteed to always have the gift you have been
